



ALCOHOL POLICY

The following is the Alcohol Policy and Guidelines of the Aberdeen District Scout Council in relation to Templars' Park.

The Council charge members of the Templars' Park Staff with ensuring that all users of Templars' Park adhere to the policy and guidelines.

"The consumption of alcohol within the confines of Templars' Park is the responsibility of the designated party leader of each user group. Such leader must take full responsibility for ensuring its group's compliance with the following guidelines. However, Aberdeen District Scout Council retains the right to stop the drinking of alcohol by any persons, if it considers such action necessary."

Guidelines

- Drinking of alcohol within the confines of Templars' Park can only be undertaken by those of 18 years of age and above and should be carried out in a responsible manner
- No alcohol should be consumed in the vicinity of those under 18 years of age
- No alcohol should be left unattended where young persons might have access to it
- Group leaders should consult members of Templars' Park staff to make known their intentions and to agree where drinking of alcohol may take place before arranging events, particularly mixed age events, barbecues, parties and other such activities
- No alcohol should be consumed outwith the group's designated site without prior agreement of members of Templars' Park staff
- All rubbish should be collected and removed safely, and deposited in the bins provided at the main gate to the Park or taken home for recycling (i.e. glass bottles)
- Any person or group failing to comply with the above may be asked to leave the campsite
- Aberdeen District Scout Council and the Templars' Management Committee retain the right to refuse future bookings from any group that fails to comply with the above
- Leaders should refer to the Scout Association alcohol policy
